



of social justice.





It may be as eyes to the blind, as feet to the lame; yea, a lifter up from the gates of death."

Feed My Lambs - another new year!

Greetings, church family! September is here, and we are kicking off the 13th year of our Feed My Lambs ministry. We are beginning the year feeding 115 children – 90 at Walls Elementary and 25 at Lake Cormorant Elementary. This number usually increases as the school year progresses. What a wonderful blessing it is to make a difference in the lives of these children!

We've received some great support from our community in August. Hinds Chapel Methodist Women made a very generous donation. Tanner Hernandez's company donated a pallet of macaroni and cheese cups — about 1400 cups. Tanner builds homes and her company is Mackenzie Grey Properties. Tanner is also the daughter of our own Andy Nye. We are so grateful for their generosity and their caring hearts.



The big fundraiser is coming September 28 – the 3rd annual Feed My Lambs BBQ and the 2nd annual car show! Neil Colley has been working tirelessly behind the scenes to coordinate and promote this event, plus requesting donations for Feed My Lambs from corporate sponsors. Neil became aware of the Feed My Lambs ministry about three years ago, learning about it from his mother, the late Nancy Colley. Nancy retired from Walls Elementary but continued to volunteer at the school and with Minor Memorial through Pack and Pray. Sadly, Nancy passed July 4, but her memory will live on through her son and their passion for Feed My Lambs. This event has been very successful the past two years and provides a major portion of our annual budget. Thank you for supporting this event and for helping spread the word. Please pick up flyers at the welcome station and pass them out. And of course, share on Facebook!

Feed My Lambs needs your support – both financially and through volunteering. We budget \$6.00 per week per child to purchase eight items – two lunches, two breakfasts and four snacks. That's a challenge with today's food prices. It takes approximately \$180.00 to feed one child for the school year. A donation of \$15.00 per month would sponsor a child for the year. That is about the cost of one fast food meal! A donation of any amount helps – the dollars (and change) add up. You can donate by cash, check, or cards (online or through the kiosk).

Volunteers are always welcome! Lajuanna Beasley and Trindie Billett will be shopping this year. Randy and Karla Lance will be delivering but would love to have backup delivery volunteers. Our first Pack and Pray is Thursday, September 5 at 10 a.m. Come whenever you can!
